Asia Masters Athletics (AMA)

The first unofficial meeting to form a body for veteran athlete in Asia was held in the year 1983 in India. The Indonesian Veteran Athletics Association with the patronage of Indonesian Amateur Athletics Federation helped to draft and present the constitution at the meeting of the General Assembly on 26th July 1986, in Jakarta, Indonesia. The draft constitution was accepted by the General Assembly and subsequently office bearers for the Asian body was elected. It was then called as the Asian veteran Athletic Association (AVAA) and officially became the Affiliate of World Association of Veteran Athletes (WAVA) in the year 1986.

However, before the formation of a formal body for Asia master athletes, championships at Asia level were already held. The first Asian Veterans Athletics Championships were held on 27th July 1981 in Singapore.

In the year 2003, the word 'veterans' was changed to 'masters' in accordance with the change in the world body from WAVA to WMA (World Masters Athletics). AVAA followed the change and became AMA (Asia Masters Athletics). The name of the championships changed from veterans to masters as well.

Asia Masters Athletics Championships (AMAC) are held biannually. AMAC is open only to men and women who are 35 years and above who are from Asia, and are medically fit to compete.

INTERESTING PLACES TO VISIT

Sightseeing Places in Tamil Nadu

1) Chennai Central Railway Station: Chennai Central Railway Station is famous for being the busiest railway station in South India and one of the most important railway hubs in the country. It's also recognized for its historical architecture and is a major transportation hub connecting Chennai to other major destinations.



2) Marina Beach: Marina Beach in Chennai is famous for being India's longest beach and the second longest in the world, extendingforabout13 kilometres. It's a popular spot for locals and tourists alike, known for its golden sand, the Bay of Bengal, and a variety of activities like walking, enjoying street food, and observing historical landmarks.




3) Fort St. George: Fort St. George in Chennai is primarily known for being the first British fortress in India and the site of the first British garrisonsettlement. It played a crucial role in establishing British influence and trade in the region. The fort also houses St. Mary's Church, the oldest Anglican Church in India, and the Fort Museum, which showcases colonial artefacts.



4) The Madras Crocodile Bank Trust & Centre: The Madras Crocodile Bank Trust & Centre for Herpetology (Croc Bank) is famous for being the world's largest crocodile sanctuary and a leading reptile conservation organization. It's also known for its work in captive breeding, scientific research, and education.



5) Valluvar Kottam: Valluvar Kottam in Chennai is famous for being a memorial monument dedicated to the revered Tamil poet and philosopher, Thiruvalluvar, known for his masterpiece, Thirukkural. It's a significant historical monument, featuring a temple-chariot-like structure and a vast auditorium, and is a popular tourist destination.



6) Saint Thomas Cathedral Basilica: Saint Thomas Church, officially known as St Thomas Cathedral Basilica and National Shrine of Saint Thomas, is a minor basilica of the Catholic Church in India, at The Saint Thomas neighborhood of Chennai, in Tamil Nadu.



7) Sri Kamakshi Amman Temple mangadu: Mangadu is known for the temple of "Tapas Kamakshi" or Goddess Kamakshi performing penance in Fire. This is the place where the goddess performed her penance to marry and re-unite with Lord Shiva. All 32 types of Dharmic rituals were performed here by the goddess.




8) Government Museum Chennai: Started in 1851, Government Museum, Chennai, or Madras Museum is the second oldest museum in India after the Indian Museum in Kolkata. Rich in archaeological and numismatic collections, the museum has the largest collection of Roman antiquities, outside Europe.



9) Kapaleeshwarar Temple: The Kapaleeshwarar Temple in Chennai is renowned for its stunning Dravidian and Vijayanagar architectural fusion, particularly its majestic Gopurams (towering gateways) adorned with intricate sculptures. It's also famous for its connection to the 63 Tamil Shaivite saint poets, the Nayanars, and the annual Brahmotsav festival celebrating them. The temple also houses a sacred tank and is known for its beautiful Punnai tree.



10) Cholamandal Artists Village: Cholamandal Artists' Village in Chennai is renowned for being the largest self-supporting artists' commune in India and a hub for the Madras Art Movement. Established in 1966, it's known for fostering a collective artistic spirit, showcasing adverse range of art forms, and contributing significantly to South Indian modernism.

9. QUALIFICATION & REGISTRATION FOR ENTRY

- 9.1 23rd Asia Masters Athletics Championships are open only to men and women who are 35 years or above by 5th November 2025, and who are medically fit to compete. Entry signifies that each competitor must follow the rules laid by the organising committee.
- 9.2 Entries shall be submitted online by the Members of Asia Masters Athletics (AMA).
- 9.3 Entries from non Members must be sent directly to 23rd AMAC LOC for approval.
- 9.4 Participants can obtain Entry Forms and all information on competition from the AMA Affiliates in their respective countries, and from: www.amac2025.com
- 9.5 Participants shall send the Entry Forms, copies of ID cards or passports (indicating the athlete's date of birth), fitness certificates, passport size photo and Entry Fee to the AMA Members in their countries.

10. Online Registration Procedures

- 10.1 Log into the 23rd AMAC registration website at:

 www.amac2025.org, to download instruction on the online registration
- 10.2 Fill in the Online Entry Form and upload passport size photo.
- 10.3 After filling in the entry forms, the Members **must bank in the total entry fee** through online transfer to the LOC, according to the payment procedure in No.16

10.4 After completing the online registration, the <u>bank slip</u> must be sent by e mail (internationalmafi@gmail.com), or mail by 20th August and late entries by 31st <u>August 2025,</u> to the following address:

11. ONLINE REGISTRATION FOR AMA MEMBERS

- 11.1 All Entries must be registered *online through Google forms provided to Members official emails* and validated by the Members.
- 11.2 An athlete can participate in a maximum of 4 individual events (track & field), Asia Masters 10 K, and 2 relay events.
- 11.3 <u>Members must collect all the entry forms and entry fee from their Master</u>
 <u>Athletes and register all the entries online through Google forms provided.</u>
- 11.4 Collect the entry fee from all the master athletes and bank in by 25th August 2025 (following the instruction in No. 16). Entries will only be accepted after receiving the entry fees. AMA Members must collect the entry form their athletes and make online entries through the Google forms provided to your official email id's.
- 11.5 Once the online registration is over, the members must log in, check all the master athletes' details and validate the registration by 30th September 2025.
- 11.6 If there are any corrections, Members must send e mail to LOC (internationalmafi@gmail.com) stating the corrections clearly, by 10th October 2025. If we don't receive any email by 10th October 2025, all the information given in registration will be accepted <u>as final, and after 10th October 2025, no changes or amendments will be entertained.</u>
- 11.7 The Members are responsible for the details given in the online registration Google forms.
- 12. AMA and the 23rd AMAC LOC are entitled to refuse any applications for insufficient information/documents concerning the championships participation and for failure of full payment. Once the application process is finished, relevant information will be unalterable or irretrievable. Once the fees related to the championships are paid, the fee will not be returned in the case of withdrawal and cancellation or delay of the championships due to weather or other reasons.
- 13. There will be no change of event / adding of event or change of competitors <u>after</u> registration procedures are completed on 31st August 2025.

17. LATE ENTRIES

Permitted with a fee of **USD 15 per event** up to 31st August **2025**. No entries will be accepted later than <u>31st August 2025</u>

18. PRIZES

- 20.1 1st to 3rd winners (men and women) will be awarded a Medal and a Merit Certificate respectively. Diploma will be presented to first 8 winners.
- 20.2 Every registered competitor will be awarded a participation certificate.
- **20.3** For the Asia Masters 10K prizes, 1st to 3rd winners (men and women) will be awarded a Medal and a Merit Certificate respectively. Diploma will be presented to first 8 winners.

19. VICTORY CEREMONY

Victory ceremony will be coordinated by the Prize Committee members. The competition events shall be given precedence over the victory ceremonies.

20. UNIFORM

All competitors are encouraged to wear uniform that is approved by their national masters' athletics associations, especially for the relay events.

23.1 Prior to the Championships all athletes must take insurance and do medical check up confirming that they are fit and healthy to participate in the championships.

23.2 During championships, a medical centre will be set up at the competition site. Only First Aid will be provided by the medical officers. Any additional medical expense is to be borne by the participant.

24. DOPING TEST

The LOC may conduct Doping test at random during the competition.

GENERAL VISA INFORMATION

DETAILS OF VISAS GRANTED BY INDIA

I. e-VISA

1 Eligibility

e-Visa is granted to a foreigner whose sole objective of visiting India is recreation, sightseeing, casual visit to meet friends or relatives, attending a short term yoga program, medical treatment including treatment under Indian systems of medicine and business purpose and no other purpose/ activity. This facility shall not be available if the person or either of his / her parents or grandparents (paternal or maternal) was born in, or was permanently resident in Pakistan. e-Visa facility shall not be available to holders of Diplomatic/Official passports, UNLP (UN Passport) holders and international travel document holders e.g. INTERPOL officials. List of countries whose nationals are presently eligible for e-visa is given in **Appendix I**.

2 <u>Procedureforapplyingfore-Visa</u>

The foreign national may fill in the application online on the website https://indianvisaonline.gov.in/visa/tvoa.html. The applicant can apply 120 days in advance prior to expected date of arrival in India.

3 Sub-categories of e-Visa

There are three sub-categories of e-Visa i.e. (a)e-Tourist Visa :For recreation, sightseeing, casual visit to meet friends or relatives, and attending a short term yoga program, (b)e- Business Visa : For all activities permitted under normal Business Visa and (c) e-Medical Visa : For medical treatment, including treatment under Indian systems of medicine. A foreign national will also be permitted to club these activities provided he/she had clearly indicated the same in the application form along with requisite documents.

4 Entrypoints

Persons holding e-Visa are allowed to enter into India only through the designated international airports namely,(1) Delhi(2) Mumbai (3)Chennai (4)Kolkata (5)Trivandrum (6) Bangalore(7) Hyderabad (8)Cochin (9)Goa (10)Ahmedabad (11)Amritsar (12)Gaya (13)Jaipur (14)Lucknow (15)Trichy (16)Varanasi (17)Calicut (18)Mangalore (19)Pune (20)Nagpur(21) Coimbatore (22)Bagdogra (23)Guwahati,(24) Chandigarh and (25) Visakhapatnam.

Further, e-visa facility is also provided for entry at 5 major Indian seaports i.e. (1) Mumbai (2) Cochin (3) Mormugao (4) Chennai and (5) New Mangalore for cruise tourists.

Persons holding e- visa can depart from any of the authorized Immigration Check Posts in India.

5 Validity

e-visa will be granted for a period up to 60 days with double entry on e-Tourist Visa and e- Business Visa and triple entry on e-Medical Visa. In the case of e-Medical Visa, extension may be granted up to 6 months on case to case basis on merits of each case by the FRRO/FRO concerned.

6 Conditionsfore-Visa

e-Visa shall be non-extendable except in the case of e-Medical Visa as mentioned in para 5above.e-visa is also non-convertible except in specific cases. Regarding conversion of e-visa to other categories of visa, please see the general policy guidelines relating to Indian visa on this website.

7 Fee for e-Visa

Fee for e-Visa for nationals of various countries will be fixed by the Government from time to time.

8 Repeat visits

e-Visa will be allowed for a maximum of two times in a calendar year to a foreigner.

II. VISA-ON-ARRIVAL

9 <u>Eligibility</u>

Visa-on-Arrival is granted to a Japanese national who is visiting India for business, tourism, conference and medical purposes. This facility shall not be available to the citizens of Japan if the person or either of his / her parents or grandparents (paternal or maternal) was born in, or was permanently resident in Pakistan. This facility shall not be available to holders of Diplomatic/Official passports and UN Passport holders having Japanese nationality.

10 Procedure for applying for Visa-on-Arrival

Japanese nationals would be required to fill an application form and approach the "Visa Counter" at the designated airport on arrival. After checking the eligibility criteria and payment of fee, the Immigration officer would then stamp Visa-on-Arrival on the passport.

11 Entry points

Visa-on-Arrival is provided to Japanese nationals only at 6 designated international airports namely, Delhi, Mumbai, Chennai, Kolkata, Bangalore and Hyderabad.

12 <u>Validity</u>

The Immigration officer may grant a double entry Visa-on-Arrival valid up to 60 days to the citizens of Japan.

13 Conditions for Visa-on-Arrival

Visa-on-Arrival shall be non-extendable and non-convertible to any other type of visa except in specific cases. Regarding conversion of Visa-on-Arrival to other categories of visa, please see the general policy guidelines relating to Indian visa on this website.

14 <u>Fee for Visa-on-Arrival</u>

A fee of Rs 2000/- or equivalent in foreign currency per passenger (including children), will be charged from each Japanese national.
